From the Founder



Looking back over the past year, it's clear that while we as a society still have a long way to go in achieving justice for street animals, our organization has made such a huge difference in the lives of countless suffering souls that I feel an immense sense of pride.

Having come a long way since our inception 19 years ago, we are now in such an esteemed position that schools and colleges want to send their students to us to learn about

animal welfare, and volunteers from far and wide want to come and help us without reward, and more and more community members come to us when they need help with a sick, injured, abused or abandoned animal. We are also receiving more collaboration requests from fellow NGOs, are fortunate to be considered worthy of donations from multiple corporations and individuals, and have even been conducting several employee engagement programs for our partners.

01 ABOUT HUMANE ANIMAL SOCIETY



HAS continues to be a lifeline for the forgotten animals of the city.

Founded in 2006 by two like-minded individuals passionate about animal welfare, The Humane Animal Society (HAS) was a small organization with a few members, minimal resources, and little support. Its primary focus was, and still is, on Animal Birth Control (ABC), proven to be the single most humane and effective way to control street animal populations.

With this as their mission, they procured a suitable facility and began slowly trying to change hearts, minds, and most importantly, the lives of suffering street animals. But it quickly became apparent that there simply wasn't enough care for

sick, orphaned, abandoned, and injured street animals. Finding it hard to turn a blind eye, they began rescuing and providing lifesaving treatment to the city's forgotten and misrepresented street animals.



Fast forward to today, and HAS is widely respected as a leading provider of safe, compassionate and affordable veterinary care in the region, recognized on both national and international platforms. In 2019, their founder, Dr. Mini Vasudevan, was honored with the prestigious Nari Shakti Puraskar for her remarkable contributions to animal welfare. Today, HAS truly has become a force to be reckoned with, a shining light in a world so often filled with darkness and cruelty.

With no plans to stop carrying out their important work, HAS continues to be a lifeline for the forgotten animals of the city and, thankfully, now does so with more support from the public, corporations, and other NGOs than ever before.

02 AN OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR



This past year, we vaccinated an unbelievable number of animals against rabies (16,786 vaccinations).

There is precious little that HAS won't do to help the voiceless. Their work includes rescuing animals struck down by passing vehicles, liberating victims of cruel and illicit breeding facilities, and providing hope for abandoned animals left clueless at the mercy of the city's harsh streets.

While so many animals have suffered in this financial year alone, we have endeavoured to help more of them than ever before, be it through lifesaving treatments, surgeries

or adoptions, and we think the figures speak for themselves.



It was also a record-breaking year for vaccination drives. With help from members of the public, local companies, and students, we administered an astounding 16,786 rabies vaccinations. We also educated hundreds of people on how to better protect their animals and their communities from this vaccine-preventable disease.

Our continued, highly successful collaborations with organizations like Pawga – which engage the community and help spread the word about our cause – were among the year’s major highlights. The highly successful

sensitization program for Bosch employees was another important achievement. There were vehicle donations, paver block donations, vaccination donations, and so many acts of generosity, compassion and selflessness from school students and individuals alike, that the year truly felt like one of the most memorable yet.

And we can’t possibly forget the continued support from our corporate partners, who remain steadfast in their commitment to our organization, and the welfare of street animals in the city and beyond.

03 TRANSFORMATIONS



In the financial year 2024–2025, we rescued 455 street animals.

It's difficult to imagine the unbearable pain some street animals are forced to endure, and yet when we look into their eyes, we invariably see an intense will to survive. Playing a part in healing and transforming such helpless souls, provides us with a great deal of comfort and satisfaction, and gives us the strength to carry on our lifesaving work, even when times are tough and emotions are running high.

In the financial year 2024-2025, HAS rescued 455 street animals, from dogs and pups, to cats and kittens, and despite all the usual challenges typically associated with running such a facility, we gave vital care to animals like Bluey and his shattered forelimb, as well as Ammu and her horrendously ripped skin.

Although some cases we face may seem helpless, we give each animal a fighting chance of recovery, and of going on to live a comfortable, pain-free

life. With a compassionate team at the helm, made up of in-house helpers, veterinarians and volunteers, we battled our way through the year right alongside the animals we rescued.

We hope the fruits of our labor are demonstrated in the glorious comebacks of the following animals, whom without medical intervention, would surely have perished.



Stories of TRANSFORMATION



Naran

With both hind legs severed below the knee in what we suspect was a despicable act of animal abuse, Naran had been suffering for far too long on the streets. Following surgery to amputate what remained of both hind limbs, this unbelievably courageous boy quickly learned how to walk using only his forelimbs, and has since settled in well to life at our sanctuary.



Poppy

Covered in multiple lacerated, stinking tumours, Poppy was being shooed away by everyone he came across, until he was rescued and brought to us. Starting him on an intensive course of chemotherapy, his tumours soon began shrinking, while his personality got bigger! Now healed and back in his community, he's currently enjoying life free from pain.



Murugan

Murugan's journey is nothing short of a miracle. He came to us broken, missing an eye, and covered in painful wounds. He was in such agony that we feared he wouldn't make it through. But this little fighter had other plans. Murugan held on, fought through the pain, and, with so much love and care, made an incredible recovery. He has also found his forever home and loving family.



04 SPECIAL SURGERIES



This past year, our veterinary team carried out 128 special surgeries.

Many of the helpless victims of abandonment, cruelty, disease and injury who come through the gates of HAS every year, require medical intervention that is beyond the realm of regular surgery. Although all surgery demands a skilled hand and methodical approach, some procedures are trickier than others. This past year, our veterinary team carried out 128 special surgeries, saving countless lives that would otherwise have been lost to cancerous tumors, shattered limbs, and broken jaws.

Velayudhan came to us with a nasty head wound and a painfully fractured jaw, while abandoned purebred pooch, Emily, had a horrible case of cherry eye.

These stories may be painful to read, and even more painful for the animals to endure. But witnessing the way these innocent creatures heal after intricate surgery, alongside the care our veterinary team provides to every animal, is more than just heartwarming; it's truly incredible.

Kavin

Following a frightening accident in which Kavin's leg was badly fractured, a decision was made to try and save the injured limb with a surgical procedure called plating. With everything going to plan, all Kavin then had to do was endure a few days of strict bed rest, before being able to enjoy his new, bionic leg!



Roshan

With a horrifying, maggot-infested wound covering much of his head and neck, Roshan was literally at death's door when he was rushed to us. While wound management was critical to his recovery, one stubborn patch refused to heal, leading to a delicate surgical procedure known as flapping. Once fully healed and over his ordeal, he was more than happy to get back to his familiar territory.



Sarvani

Making her very survival a struggle, Sarvani's mouth tumour was slowly killing her. But, after emergency tumour and lymph node-removal surgery, she wasted no time demonstrating her ability to bounce back from the brink, and is recovering remarkably well.

06 ANIMAL BIRTH CONTROL & VACCINATIONS



In a collaborative effort with various partners, we carried out a series of lifesaving rabies vaccination drives across the city.

Two of our primary focuses as an organization are Animal Birth Control (ABC) and vaccinations. In addition to spaying and neutering every rescued animal (provided they are well enough for surgery), we regularly catch dogs for ABC and actively encourage community members to register their animals for the procedure. No animal is adopted from us without having first been spayed or neutered, and the same applies to vaccinations. Just as with ABC, we vaccinate every rescued animal, carry out periodic drives to vaccinate street animals, and actively encourage the annual vaccination of all pets adopted from us (which we provide for free) as well as community pets.

Spaying and neutering is the single most humane method



of controlling the street dog population and reducing the spread of certain diseases, and in the financial year of 2024 to 2025, HAS carried out 2,921 ABC surgeries and vaccinated 16,786 cats and dogs.

Vaccinations can protect animals from a number of potentially fatal diseases, such as rabies, parvovirus, canine distemper and canine hepatitis, and last financial year, we administered a total of 16,786 lifesaving MCV, ARV, and TRICAT vaccinations to animals.

While vaccinating isn't just about rabies and reducing its transmission from animals to humans, it remains a significant priority of ours as we strive to create a safer, healthier environment for both the humans and animals of the city. This financial year, we formed alliances with HCL Foundation, KSPCA (Kodaikanal Society for the Protection of Animals), The Pawsome People Project, WVS (Worldwide Veterinary Services), and Mission Rabies to carry out a series of vaccination drives, in which more than 10,600 street animals and community pets received protection against rabies.

In observance of World Rabies Day on the 28th September, HAS teamed up with HCL Foundation for a vaccination drive spanning an entire week. With timely help from compassionate volunteers, community caretakers and college students, we administered vaccinations to 865 dogs, and educated countless people as to the risks of the disease and the importance of vaccinating, along the way.

Mission Rabies carried out a series of vaccination drives, in which more than 10,600 street animals and community pets received protection against rabies.



07 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS



Engaging with over 5,000 people from our city and beyond has always generated incredible results.

It's impossible to underestimate the transformative, unifying power of community, and engaging with people from our city and beyond, has always generated incredible results.

From educating and informing, to supporting and empowering, our community engagements are extremely important to us, and many suffering animals have benefitted from them over the years.

Our collaborations with Pawga - the initiative of three students and India's first pet yoga for human and animal welfare - have always been fun and engaging, while also highlighting our cause and the many rescued animals available for adoption. From yoga and reading, to a movie night and art class, all accompanied by adorable, adoptable pups and dogs, every event has proved popular and highly rewarding.



With more schools and colleges wanting their students to come and learn from our organization and participate in our activities every year, it seems as if barely a week passes now without groups of children buzzing around, helping, learning and positively engaging with our rescued pets. Students from Yuvhabharati and RUH Continuum School, spent many hours on several different occasions, volunteering and helping us maintain our ABC and Rescue Center.



Our longstanding collaboration with Ford saw us invited to participate in their NGO Partner Connect and Capacity Building Workshop, which brought more than 20 NGO partners together, and provided everyone present with the opportunity to network, share ideas, and build up their skillsets.

As part of their fundraising efforts for Mission India, members of the Mission Planet team visited our shelter to spend time with our animals, interview our founder, and raise awareness of HAS's cause.

With help from MARS, the parent company behind Pedigree and Royal Canin, we hosted another adoption drive, during which every new pet parent was gifted a Pedigree starter pack courtesy of MARS. Actively promoting the adoption of Indies, we salute MARS for their continued support of both our organization, and our cause.



We were also invited to attend a recent Pooch Party event, the first of its kind in Coimbatore. With a stall selling our merchandise and a Q and A session from our resident senior veterinarian, it was great to see a desire from attendees to learn more about animal welfare, and to support our cause.

Having enjoyed continued support from FANUC India, they generously gifted us a brand new vehicle intended to help our ABC efforts, which we have been busy putting to good use.



Staunch supporters of ours, HCL Foundation, organized an insightful and inspiring Animal Welfare Convergence Workshop in Bengaluru, which brought together a range of partners, and gave everyone present a chance to learn from each other.

We have also been playing host to groups of employees from the local branch of Bosch, both for general volunteering, and for their animal sensitization certificate program, which has been running successfully for the past couple of years.
